

Dr. Douglas A. Freeman is Professor and Dean of the Western College of Veterinary Medicine, at the University of Saskatchewan. He earned his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and Master of Science degrees from the University of Minnesota, where he also conducted a clinical residency. He earned a doctoral degree in reproductive physiology from the University of Idaho and is a Diplomate (and past-president) of the American College of Theriogenologists (ACT). Freeman just recently became the first non-U.S. college dean ever elected as President of the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC). During Freeman's 33-year career in veterinary medicine and academic administration, his diverse experience included professional practice and work in the veterinary pharmaceutical industry. He also had extensive service at several universities such as the University of Massachusetts at Amherst for six years, New Zealand's Massey University for three years, and nine years as department head at North Dakota State University before being appointed dean of the WCVM in 2010. Freeman has contributed substantially to the establishment of several key partnerships at the University of Saskatchewan including the One Health Initiative, the Global Institute for Food Security, the Sylvia Fedoruk Canadian Centre for Nuclear Innovation, and an emerging Livestock and Forage Centre of Excellence.
