





When WHO's Director General, Dr. Margaret Chan, visited Cuba in July 2014, she was impressed with the prevention-based model as a foundation of the health care system with links to health research and development. Touted as a model for effective health research and development. Touted as a model for effective universal health coverage over the past several decades, Cuba was an ideal setting to host Cuba Salud 2015, an international public health convention whose theme, "Health for all: universide coverage," convened international research exchanges to high-light evidence-based practices for diagnosis, prevention and control of chronic and infectious diseases with effective service delivery models. Social determinants of health were discussed with respect to related barriers to health equity and optimal population health.


First, communities should be en-couraged to take ownership of envir-onmental protection and hygienic practices to control rodent invasion into urban dwellings and reduce ordent breeding areas, and to symptoms to health facilities. Second, health authorities should prioritise annual training of health workers in the application of universal safety precautions for infection control and regular epidemic response drills, with periodic evaluations. Third, policy makers should provide a description of disease signs and symptoms in parpropriate health improvement practices, and publicise toll-free tele-phone lines for systematic reporting and surveillance. Fourth, the One Health approach's should be applied to minimise human health risks y advocating for environmental sustainability, reduced bosh burn-ing practices, and preservation of vector habitats.




