2. Description and Scope of One Health Activities

The WVA represents around 500.000 veterinarians around the world through its 95-member associations and is a broad global veterinary community that offers advocacy, support, and education with a variety of partners for focused global veterinary issues.

The WVA mission is to assure and promote animal health and welfare and public health globally, through developing and advancing veterinary medicine, the veterinary profession as well as public and private veterinary services.

To achieve its mission, the WVA implementing the One Health approach encouraging veterinarians all over the world to work together with other health professionals at the local, national, and international levels to advance the health and well-being of people, animals and the environment.

WVA Activities in the field of One Health (the list is not exhaustive. More information can be found on the WVA website):

- The WVA adopted and published a number of position papers on One Health and related issues.
- The WVA has collaboration agreements with a number of Global Organizations including action plans to tackle global One Health concerns.
- Together with the World Medical Association (WMA), the WVA published a number of joint statements and supported each-other on various One Health issues such as rabies control, Antimicrobial Resistance and the regular availability of Ketamine.
- The WVA and WMA also organized two Global Conferences on One Health. One in Spain in 2015 with the collaboration of the Spanish Medical and Veterinary

Associations and a second one in Japan, assisted by the Japanese Medical and Veterinary Associations. The main outcome of this conference was the historic signature on the Memorandum of Fukuoka by WVA, WMA, JMA and JVMA on One Health approach. The WVA/WMA initiatives encouraged a number WVA and WMA members to adopt this model of collaboration and to sign similar agreements between Veterinary and Medical associations at national level to use the One Health Approach in their countries.

- WVA collaborates and organizes Global Summit conferences on One Health issues together with the FAO, OIE and WHO Tripartite to tackle different One Health Concerns. By now, five Summit meetings took places around the world.
- Since 2000, WVA celebrates the World Veterinary Day on the last Saturday of April to recognize the work of veterinarians around the world for their contributions to improve animal health and welfare, as well as public health. Since 2008, with collaboration with the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE), the WVA organize the World Veterinary Day Award to reward the most successful contribution by the veterinary profession on the selected annual theme. Many of the selected themes are important One Health issues such as One World, One Health: more cooperation between veterinarians and physicians (2010), Rabies control (2011), Antimicrobial resistance (2012), Vector-borne Diseases with a Zoonotic Potential (2015), Continuing Education with One Health Focus (2016) and Antimicrobial Resistance-from Awareness to Action (2017)
- WVA and HealthforAnimals launched <u>Animal Health Matters</u>, a new online resource that aims to educate and build greater awareness of the most pressing issues in animal and human health, including AMR.
