#### 9. Brief History of Your Organization's One Health Involvement

The initiative started as a blog called 'My Animal, My Health' which was established in February 2016 by

Dr. Kikiope Oluwarore, a veterinarian and public health professional. The blog provided and promoted news and information on related topics of veterinary practice, animal health, and public health. As the blog gained traction and publicity, her work expanded to taking up major health and investigative journalism projects that promoted public education and advocacy on correlated issues of animal and human health. Notable examples of this work included the Project Abattoir Nigeria (2017) funded by Code4Africa's ImpactAFRICA program which produced the published



story series – <u>Something Dreadful is happening at Ibadan Abattoir</u>, <u>For the love of meat, You must read</u> this, and <u>Unhealthy Abattoirs in Nigeria</u>, recommendations and solutions; and Project Fish and Oceans (2018) supported by <u>Internews' Earth Journalism Network (EJN)</u> which produced the story Nigeria: <u>Importing fish amidst abundant ocean resources</u>; the paradox of a nation. This build-up of impact reporting projects led to an eventual scale-up to the nonprofit organization that it is today.

In June 2019, One Health and Development Initiative (OHDI) became institutionalized and officially registered at the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) of the Federal Republic of Nigeria with registration number – CAC/IT/NO 130955. In addition to being institutionalized, OHDI's vision was encompassed to accommodate all aspects, tenets and values of One Health for integrated promotion of animal, human and ecosystem health.
